Tentative, awkward, or inappropriate moves with laryngoscope; needs guidance to optimize view	Properly positions laryngoscope blade tip in vallecula (or on epiglottis) without guidance; independently visualizes cords	Smooth, atraumatic, and efficient laryngoscopy; directs effective cricoid manipulation to optimize view

Endotracheal Tube Handling:

Novice	Competent	Expert
Inadequate control of tube position, stylet, or cuff; guidance needed to achieve correct depth	Inserts tube to correct depth and maintains adequate control; appropriate handling of stylet and cuff	Smooth, atraumatic, and efficient tube insertion to correct depth with good control of tube position at all times

Tentative or seems unsure of next move; many unnecessary moves	Demonstrates some forward planning with reasonable progression of procedure; efficient time/motion but some unnecessary moves	Obviously plans course of procedure with effortless flow from one move to the next; clear economy of movement and maximum efficiency
