
Introduction


- → This study was designed to investigate physician medicine modalities in the clinical practice. exposure to IM influences recommendations of integrative their interest in IM and previous or current educational attitudes towards integrative medicine (IM) and whether
- 2.1% of adults in the USA report herbal medicine use in the past year.
- Ψ 52% of the US population reports using supplements, supplement. including vitamins, minerals, and non-vitamin/non-mineral
- → Of the above 52% use of supplements other than multivitamins was reported at 34-39%

Methods


- Medical Group in Phoenix, Arizona. administered to 21 Family Medicine residents at Abrazo and understanding of IM treatment modalities was educational experiences, as well as a general knowledge survey assessing physicians' personal attitudes, previous Between 10/2018 and 2/2019, a 10-question electronic Health Network and 89 practicing physicians of the Abrazo
- → The responses to questions were reviewed via aggregate data for trends

Results

- → 90% of physicians wanted to learn IM modalities, >50% of the physicians requested referrals. patients regarding IM modalities and reported having been approached by
- >70% of physicians have had no residency. exposure to IM in medical school or
- → >50% of physicians state patients have initiated conversations regarding IM
 - reported feeling that patient recommend the service. colleague or family member highly influenced to recommend IM services to patients if either a
 - Almost 100% of surveyed physicians satisfaction would increase with IM
- → 60% of physicians were of the opinion improve patient care. that resident education in IM would

Discussion

45% of physicians reported feeling

- The majority of patients who use services to their health care providers. complementary and alternative medicine treatment modalities do not disclose these
- 46% of patients reported "it wasn't state "the doctor never asked". important for my doctor to know" and 57%
- Physicians must be knowledgeable initiate the conversation regarding such regarding IM therapy and be willing to
