

recruitment season?




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

Medicine?




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Q34 - Receiving post-interview thank you notes or other communication from a program affected how you ranked a program.


Q19 - Receiving post-interview gifts had increased importance to me as an applicant during a virtual recruitment season.



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
Q28 - The opportunity to train with inpatient teams at both an unopposed community

hospital and an academic center is an appealing aspect to EVMS Family Medicine.




Q31 - The size of each residency class at EVMS Family Medicine played a significant

factor in my ranking decision for the program.




Q33 - The residents being split at two separate continuity clinic sites played a significant








Q2 - Learning more details about the residency merger on interview day positively affected my overall impression of the residency program.



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Q35 - Did you ask a question (or questions) about the residency merger?




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Q36 - When did you ask your question(s) about the residency merger? Please select all that apply.




Q9 - All of my questions regarding the EVMS Family Medicine residency merger were sufficiently answered by the end of the interview day.





Q7 - The residents did a good job answering questions you had regarding the EVMS



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



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




On the other hand, I appreciate being given the info about the merger. I would not be happy learning about it after the fact. But yeah I would rank EVMS higher.




How much less detail should the residency merger receive?

I really enjoyed my interview with EVMS, I got a good feeling about the program culture and I felt that the residents were happy and eager to be present for the interview experience. Geography was the primary consideration in my selection of a program, had geography not been a significant factor, I would absolutely rank this program very high on my list.

Great resident to faculty interview ratio. It was a pleasure to interview but I did feel limited by the virtual process. This was one of the later interviews I had but it did feel special mostly due to the program director and the residents that interviewed me. I would not change anything from the interview process in retrospect.

I truly enjoyed the entire EVMS interview process. I personally thought the merger brought a lot of positive change to the program and offered incoming residents more opportunities to experience both academic and community hospital settings! The residents were very knowledgeable about the merger for the most part.

My only advice would be to have honesty within communication and Interview season. EVMS was actually ranked Incredibly high for me with discussion of Incredibly encouraging words. Although I'm Incredibly happy with my program, it was a surprise to see I ended up elsewhere on match day.

I enjoyed the interview, and felt a lot of faith and excitement after talking with the program director. My match list was driven by geographic factors.

the merger seemed to be completed and there were no concerns

I had been in touch with one of the residents who was kind enough to be very honest with me. This person actually improved EVMS's ranking on my list. I'm interested in a community based program (and that only) and not being able to guarantee that was a big negative factor for me. Another reason I didn't rank EVMS 1st (it was still very high on my list) was the merger. There was still a lot to confirm and changes are often anticipated with such large-scale merger. As residents, we are "locked" in the program for 3 years and I personally would rather know all the good and all the bad before I commit. I highly value stability. Another factor was the relationship between the two groups of residents and how they seemed to interact with each other, as competitors vs as colleagues, even before they have been merged/forced to work together as one team.

I didn't put much weight on the merger. It seemed like the transition was handled well and things are organized now. I loved my interview day and all of the people in the program. I chose a different program higher due to its strong focus on addiction medicine.

I truly loved the program and would have been thrilled to have matched with you, and actually had the program as number two on my rank order list. I was fortunate to match with my first choice, who I had ranked primarily based on it's ideal location for me. The merger really was of no importance to me because the program itself seemed so wonderful and both continuity clinics seemed appealing. I can't say whether the virtual format had an impact on my decision as this was the case for every other interview I did. But I will say that every person I met was so welcoming and seemed like they'd be a joy to work with. There was a strongly positive vibe and I enjoyed every aspect of the interview process. The hand-written letter was very nice to receive and I really appreciated Dr. Snelling's writing it. Ultimately, I don't think receiving one versus not receiving one would play a significant role in my decision, but it does show that he really cares and is willing to take the time to connect with his residents on a personal level. If two programs were neck and neck and I was having a really hard time choosing between them, the one that sent me a letter would likely get the higher rank. All that said, I don't really have any recommendations for future interview seasons because I loved the program, and not ranking it as number one was no fault or deficiency of the program, there just happened to be one that, for me, was more ideal.

I always think more information is better, and loved the online materials you offered! If could be nice if you made an anonymous Q&A tab on your website before interview season, and then have those questions posted online during/after, because sometimes programs would talk about learning opportunities that they offered, and there was no way to reference if that was also offered at other programs unless you asked and wrote it down or could find it posted somewhere! Overall I loved my interview day and ranked you very highly.

We welcome any additional qualitative feedback you'd like to provide on you...

I thoroughly enjoyed the EVMS interview process! It was one of my best interview experiences. I ranked EVMS highly because I could imagine myself working there, and because of the hybrid community-academic aspect of the program. I ranked my home institution program highest because the percent of their grads that practice OB is higher than the national average of FamMed resident grads that practice OB (and I am interested in practicing OB).

Absolutely loved this program. Great Interview day. Great residents and staff.

I felt that the interview process was very good and I came away feeling like I knew the program very well and with a positive impression. EVMS was just as good as any of the programs I looked at and geographical location was by far the most important factor for me in differentiating between many good programs. The merger was not a red flag for me and I appreciated getting some info about it.

I enjoyed my conversations with your faculty/residents so much. I did not think in my head that I would have ranked you guys as high (bc I didn't know much about you guys) but after my interview day you shot up my list so fast. I would have been honored to be a part of your great team! Also I did not think the merger was over talked about. I thought it was very appropriate and kept short and sweet unless otherwise asked about it. For me it was a positive and allowed for greater opportunity. I think you guys emphasized that well.

Merger was briefly discussed and the answers received made me feel confident in the program.
